

### EASY, ELEGANT EGGNOG

- 1/2 gallon of cold milk, divided
- 3.4 oz French vanilla pudding mix
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp. nutmeg

In a large bowl, whisk 3/4 cup milk and the pudding mix until smooth.
